<p><b>Available August 2022</b>  <b>Postdoctoral/Post-Master's Residency</b>          We will have 2 full-time post-graduate residency positions for the 2022-23 academic year (beginning August 10, 2022 and ending May 19, 2023).</p> <p><b>Focus</b>          The postgraduate residency program has an emphasis on issues of social justice and addressing the mental health and wellbeing of HSU students of color. Residents will work closely with our Cultural Centers for Academic Excellence (CCAEE), providing outreach and direct service to underserved populations. The program aspires to have an impact on the equity gap in retention and graduation of first generation and underrepresented minority (URM) students as part of the GI2025 initiative.</p> <p><b>Positions</b>          We are soliciting applications for 2 full-time post-graduate residency positions for the 2022-23 academic year (beginning August 10, 2022 and ending May 19, 2023). Residents will be responsible for providing: (a) short term individual, couples, and group therapy; (b) intake and referral services; (c) crisis intervention and daytime on-call services; (d) outreach programming and liaison work (particularly with our Cultural Centers [CCAEE], and specifically with El Centro Académico Cultural); and (e) psychological consultation to the campus community. Residents will work closely with medical providers in the Student Health and Wellbeing Services on shared cases. <b>Minimum Qualifications:</b>	<p><b>Degree:</b> Applicants must have completed a doctoral degree in clinical or counseling psychology, or a master's degree in counseling or clinical psychology (e.g., leading toward licensure as an MFT or LPCC) or in social work (leading to the LCSW). The degree must come from a regionally accredited institution of higher education or an APA/CPA-accredited program and pre-doctoral internship meeting <a href="#">APPIC (Association for Psychology Postdoctoral and Internship Centers) standards</a> as CAPS is a member of <a href="#">APPIC</a>.</p> <p>Strong interest and experience serving multicultural populations is required. Given HSU's designation as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), applicants with a demonstrated commitment to, expertise in, and experience with the Latinx community are particularly encouraged to apply.</p>

<b>Minimum Qualifications:</b>	<b>Degree:</b> Post-Doctoral Fellows have completed the requirements of a terminal academic degree in an accredited PhD, PsyD or EdD program, but need to complete the additional post-degree supervised professional experience prior to licensing.
	<b>Experience:</b> Pre-doctoral internship meeting APPIIC (Association for Psychology Postdoctoral and Internship Centers) standards as CAPS is a member of APPIIC. Experience should include individual and group psychotherapy.

	<p>The salary for post-doctoral residents is generally \$3,400/month and the salary for post-master degree residents is generally \$2,658/month (pay will be prorated for partial months worked). The positions are classified within the faculty unit and carry full benefits. The residency is for the duration of the academic year (a little over 9 months), with vacation during Thanksgiving break, winter holiday, and spring break. Residents will be provided with professional development funding (and release time) focused on cultural competence / trauma informed care, have faculty privileges on campus (library privileges, access to employee wellness and employee assistance programs, etc.), &amp; the added benefit of living in an extraordinarily beautiful place. In addition, residents will be provided with an on-campus meal plan covering meals Monday through Friday of the academic year. On-campus housing is also being offered as part of the overall package for those who have interest. The hillside campus overlooks Humboldt Bay and the Pacific Ocean, amidst the surrounding Redwood forest. As one of the smaller campuses of the California State University system, with about 6,000 students, HSU is known for its open and friendly campus environment. CAPS is housed in the Student Health &amp; Counseling (SHC) and Behavioral and Social Sciences (BSS) buildings on campus. Each resident will have a private office, with computer and internet access, and a video camera for supervision. The counseling facility includes a group room, a professional conference room, and a staff kitchen. CAPS is part of the larger Student Health and Wellbeing Services unit which consists of 10-12 professional therapists, a psychiatrist,</p>

	<p>a case manager, medical providers, and health educators working in collaboration. Peer consultation is emphasized and constantly utilized in a supportive and collegial atmosphere. The staff is especially interested in residents who will support this type of work environment. Residents will engage in both formal and informal supervisory contact with all professional staff. In addition to supervision, residents will participate in our weekly case conference and training seminar. Professionals at CAPS represent a range of theoretical orientations.</p>
